Subject: - Grant of conditional permission to Beehive Ayurved Medical College & Hospital, Central Hopetown, Selaqui, Dehradun-248197, Uttarakhand (Inst. ID. AYU0455) by reducing intake capacity from 60 seat to 30 Seat in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2021-22 under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder in respect of appeal dated 27.11.2021 - reg.

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that Ministry of AYUSH vide its letter no. L.14011/3/2020-EP (1) dated 26.03.2021 and 15.04.2021 issued Relaxation/support policy for ASU&S colleges in unprecedented times of COVID-19 pandemic for the academic session 2021-22 and the permission for the academic year 2021-22 of the ASU&S colleges will be considered on the basis of part-I visitation proforma submitted by the college.

Beehive Ayurved Medical College & Hospital, Central Hopetown, Selaqui, Dehradun-248197, Uttarakhand has been carefully examined in terms of concerned Regulation and it is found that the college was not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for conducting UG (BAMS) course with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2021-22.

Accordingly by following principle of natural justice and as per direction of President MARBISM, an opportunity of hearing was granted to the college on 29.09.2021 to present their case virtually.

Further, observation of hearing committee dated 29.09.2021, was placed before President, MARBISM and it was decided by the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM to issue denial permission to the said college with 60 seats in BAMS (UG) course under Section 28/29 of NCISM, Act 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, which was communicated to the college vide MARB letter ref. no 03-04/2021 Ay.(100) dated 12.11.2022.

Thereafter, an appeal dated 27.11.2021 under section 28 sub-section of the National Commission for Indian System of medicine act, 2020 against the order dated 12.11.2021 of Medical Assessment and Rating Board in respect of denial of permission to the college, has been received in the commission, which was placed before Chairman, NCISM and Chairman, NCISM constituted a committee to decide the appeal comprising the following members:-

1. Dr. Sreenivasa Prasad Buduru, President, Board of Ayurveda
2. Dr. K Jagannathan, President, Board of Unani, Siddha and Sowa-Rigpa

Accordingly, letter has been sent to the college vide Commission's letter dated 02.12.2021 to appear before the designated hearing committee on dated 06.12.2021 in respect of appeal filed by the college under section 28 of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020 against the disapproval order of conditional permission.

The proceeding of appeal was held on virtually on 06.12.2021 at 03.30 PM and on behalf of college Dr. Kanwaljit Singh Ahuja, Principal attended the hearing. The hearing committee

sought clarification from the representatives of the college regarding the order as well as shortcomings mentioned in the order dated 06.12.2021 passed by MARB Board as under:-

We have 7 higher and 18 lower faculties distributed in all 14 departments. We have minimum, one faculty in each department. As per policy letter ref. no. 26-75/2021-Ay (visitation) dated 10.09.2021, I want to give undertaking on behalf of management and as principal of the college.</p> <p>That, Beehive Ayurveda Medical College & Hospital would like to avail the benefit of said policy in which NCISM has given relaxation for additional 10 percent as per the RMS 2016. Hence, in view of above the committee recommends to consider the appeal of Beehive Ayurved Medical College & Hospital, Central Hopetown, Selaqui, Dehradun-248197, Uttarakhand, against the denial for conducting UG (BAMS) course with 60 seats under Section 28 of NCISM, Act 2020 and grant conditional permission to the college by reducing intake capacity from 60 seat to 30 Seat for UG (BAMS) course as per dispensation/relaxation policy vide letter No. 26-75/2021-Ay.(Visitation) dated 10.09.2021.

3. Therefore, the recommendation of hearing committee has been placed before Chairman, National Commission for Indian System of Medicine and it has been decided by the Chairman, National Commission for Indian System of medicine to consider the recommendation and decided **to grant conditional permission to Beehive Ayurved Medical College & Hospital, Central Hopetown, Selaqui, Dehradun-248197, Uttarakhand by reducing intake capacity from 60 seat to 30 Seat for UG (BAMS) course for the session 2021-22** subject to the following conditions:-
- The fulfilment of conditions as specified in the Undertaking/Indemnity bond submitted by the college.
 - The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
4. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 60 UG (BAMS) seats shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats

under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2021-22 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.

5. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
6. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of National Commission for Indian System of Medicine.
7. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college before applying for the next academic year (before opening of part-1, visitation Proforma) to get permission for the session 2022-23:
 - (i) all the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
 - (ii) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);
 - (iii) all the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in to;
8. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission from the academic session 2022-23.
9. This is issued with the approval of Competent Authority.
